**CREWS CONTINUE WORK ON INGALLS AVENUE WATER LEAK  
Homes and Businesses between 8<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup> Streets Can Expect Water Shut Off**

(Monday, June 17, 2019) – Repair crews have been working over the weekend to repair a water leak reported late Friday near Ingalls and 8<sup>th</sup> Street. The City issued a notice that water pressure would be affected and advised those in the area between 8<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Streets and Ingalls Avenue to Taylor Avenue to boil water until further notice.

**THIS ADVISORY REMAINS IN EFFECT UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.**

The repairs conducted since Friday evening have not produced a sustainable result, therefore residents and businesses should expect water to be shut off for the area between 8<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> Streets and from Ingalls Avenue to Taylor Avenue. This will allow more extensive repair work to be done. We have no estimate of when normal water service will return to the area.

When water service to this area returns, all businesses and residents are advised to boil their water until we issue an Advisory that water testing is successful and normal use can resume. Anyone experiencing *low water pressure* should also boil their water.

We apologize for the inconvenience and appreciate the cooperation of the public as we work to restore service to the public. Please exercise caution when traveling in this (or any) construction area for your own safety and for the safety of work crews.
