Mardi Gras History- Most of us know that Mardi Gras officially started in the early 1700’s in Mobile, AL. But, did you know its origins go back even farther than that? At the start of every Spring, thousands of years ago, pagans in the Roman Empire would hold fertility festivals like Saturnalia and Lupercalia. When Christianity arrived in Rome, Church leadership found it easier to incorporate these existing celebrations into the new faith, rather than abolish them completely. As a result, the excess and revelry associated with the pagan festivals became a way to mark the beginning of the forty-day period of fasting and penance of the season of Lent. From there, the tradition spread with Christianity to other parts of Europe and finally to the Americas. Today, Mardi Gras is celebrated in Brazil, the Cayman Islands, many countries in Europe, and of course, the United States.
